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Common Q&A's

What is wrong with teaching kids about racial justice and equity, shouldn't we want children to be aware of injustice?

There isn't anything wrong with children learning about the good, the bad, and the ugly of American (and world) history. However, how it is taught is important. It is not a teacher's responsibility to teach from the position of their opinions or from their ideological perspective.

But education is inherently political. Why do people think that education is not a political act?

There are some people who believe this, and there are those who disagree. My position is not conclusive on this subject - instead, I believe that education is about learning and that scholarship should be the ultimate goal.

Teachers are underpaid and under-resourced. What do you say to those who feel that educators are under attack because of these divisive conversations?

I agree that many teachers are underpaid and under-resourced....and they are under-prepared. Which should all be reasons why we should be more supportive of teachers teaching, not teachers being immersed in cultural and social engineering. Public funds should go towards teacher training that helps educators teach students how to read, compose an essay, and do mathematics.
